1. Week 2-Evangelism theme verse review
  - a. **Romans 10:14b** "...And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?"
  - b. Notice the verse introduces the concept of a preacher.
  - c. A person is vital to this process. You are vital!
  - d. Let's review Acts 10 (Peter and Cornelius)

      1. John 4:1-6—Jesus made it a point to go through Samaria.
      2. 2 Timothy 4:5 "But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry."
      3. Where do you need to purpose to go? Where is your well?

      1. John 4:7-8—Get the conversation going with something simple; Jesus asked for a cup of water.
      2. 2 Timothy 4:2 "Preach the Word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching."

    - iii. **Make sure** you \_\_\_\_\_.
      1. John 4:9—When engaging in conversation, be ready to listen.
      2. Listen some more.
      3. James 1:19 "So then, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak..."
      4. Pay attention to the words and phrases people use. They give you a clue into where their heart is at.
      5. People do not care how much you know until they know how much you care.

    - 1. John 4:10
    - 2. Make a spiritual statement and ask a spiritual question.
    - 3. Acts 17:23–Paul does this well.
    - 4. “Last week at church, my pastor was talking about what happens after death. Is that something you’ve ever thought about?” Or “I saw on the news last night about all the hate and racism happening. Made me wonder where in the human heart that comes from. What do you think?”
  - v. **L**ovingly establish a \_\_\_\_\_.
    - 1. John 4:13-14,17-18
    - 2. Allow the person’s story to establish their needs.
    - 3. Genesis 3:6-7, Romans 1:25
    - 4. Phrases like “It seems like...”, “I noticed that...”, “You mentioned...”, or “You keep saying...”
  - vi. **E**xplain the \_\_\_\_\_.
    - 1. John 4:21-24, 26
    - 2. Share the truth of what you believe.
    - 3. “I know for me, I found truth in...”
    - 4. John 9:25 “He answered and said, “Whether He is a sinner or not I do not know. One thing I know: that though I was blind, now I see.” Your testimony is truth.
